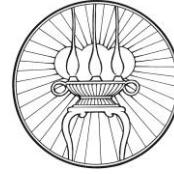

NOTES TO ENHANCE YOUR WORSHIP AT OSL:

Luther, not being at a loss for words, has two analogies to give us insight into the oneness and fellowship of the Holy Christian community. "Just as the bread is made out of many grains ground and mixed together, and out of the bodies of many grains there comes the body of one bread, so we take on the common body of Christ. Just as the drops of wine lose their own form and become the common body of wine, so should it be with us. Then by divine love, Christ with all saints takes upon Himself our form. He fights against sin, death, and all evil. We in turn rely upon His righteousness, life, and blessedness. And through interchange we become one loaf, one body, one drink." Shall we then take upon the form of other Christians and their necessity? And in real fellowship is the true significance of the Christian community changed by the love of God.

Epistle

1 Corinthians 2:1-16

And I, when I came to you, brothers, did not come proclaiming to you the testimony of God with lofty speech or wisdom. For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. And I was with you in weakness and in fear and much trembling, and my speech and my message were not in plausible words of wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power, that your faith might not rest in the wisdom of men but in the power of God.

Yet among the mature we do impart wisdom, although it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to pass away. But we impart a secret and hidden wisdom of God, which God decreed before the ages for our glory. None of the rulers of this age understood this, for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But, as it is written, “What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him”—these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit. For the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. For who knows a person’s thoughts except the spirit of that person, which is in him? So also no one comprehends the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might understand the things freely given us by God. And we impart this in words not taught by human wisdom but taught by the Spirit, interpreting spiritual truths to those who are spiritual.

The natural person does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are folly to him, and he is not able to understand them because they are spiritually discerned. The spiritual person judges all things, but is himself to be judged by no one. “For who has understood the mind of the Lord so as to instruct him?” But we have the mind of Christ.

Constitution/Bylaws Update - The Minnesota South District Constitution Committee has reviewed our Constitution and Bylaws in the first part of January. They could not grant approval to our submission. There are four minor areas of changes that we need to make. They include: Articles of Incorporation filing; requirements for membership; membership in organizations whose principles conflict with the Word of God; and calling ordained or commissioned ministers. The Constitution and Bylaws subcommittee will be reviewing their comments and making appropriate changes. After those changes are made, the congregation will need to approve the updated version, and we will need to re-submit to Minnesota South. Their next deadline is March 27, 2026. Stay tuned for more details as we migrate through this process.
