NOTES TO ENHANCE YOUR WORSHIP AT OSL:

Scripture readings and a message (a sermon) were common aspects of worship in Jesus' day. Evidence of this is found in Luke 4:16-30. There, on a Sabbath day in the synagogue in Nazareth, we're told of Jesus reading from the scroll of Isaiah and then speaking about what He'd read. Since these things are done in our worship services today, we have a connection, of sorts, with worshippers in the past.

2 Corinthians 12:1-10

I must go on boasting. Though there is nothing to be gained by it, I will go on to visions and revelations of the Lord. I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows. And I know that this man was caught up into paradise—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows— and he heard things that cannot be told, which man may not utter. On behalf of this man I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. Though if I should wish to boast, I would not be a fool, for I would be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think more of me than he sees in me or hears from me. So to keep me from being too elated by the surpassing greatness of the revelations, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to harass me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I pleaded with the Lord about this, that it should leave me.
