Notes to enhance your worship at Our Savior's Lutheran:

Many analogies can be used to explain how important Sunday morning church is, but few resonate more than: pasture, table, feast. What God is doing in the Divine Service is preparing to nurture your faith. As much as you may enjoy a brunch buffet with every breakfast type imaginable, doesn't your soul deserve a feast as well? The Holy Word of God is that pasture upon which the lambs of the flock may eat. The table is meaningful time together with family and with God. The feast is the opportunity to eat until you are full. Do not miss out on the five-course meal of Sacred Scripture that Jesus is providing. Martin Luther writes, "You must pay attention to the words of God above all else! Exalt them. Highly treasure them. Hold fast to them." And the best way to do that is to "feast" upon them around the table of the Lord.

Matthew 16:13-20

Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, “Who do people say that the Son of Man is?” And they said, “Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.” He said to them, “But who do you say that I am?” Simon Peter replied, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.” And Jesus answered him, “Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father who is in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.” Then he strictly charged the disciples to tell no one that he was the Christ.
