### **NOTES TO ENHANCE YOUR WORSHIP AT OSL:**

I knew I had entered Lutheran territory of the Midwest, when I was taught in the Hutchinson Circuit to pray Lutheran prayers for our meals. We most certainly ask a blessing on our food, and we return thanks to God after our meal... or at least that's how Martin Luther directs us. Looking at the daily prayers in Luther's Small Catechism, you find that there are the Morning and Evening Prayer, but there is also directions on the blessing and thanks. As is truly fine to have local customs, we pray the Common Table prayer and then return thanks from Psalm 136. What I recently learned from Luther's Works is that he derives this from 1 Timothy 4:4-5. "For everything created by God is good, and nothing is to be rejected if it is received with thanksgiving, for it is made holy by the word of God and prayer." How beautiful is our relationship with God that He even provides food for the sower and bread for the eater today. Give thanks to the Lord for the bounty on your table through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen

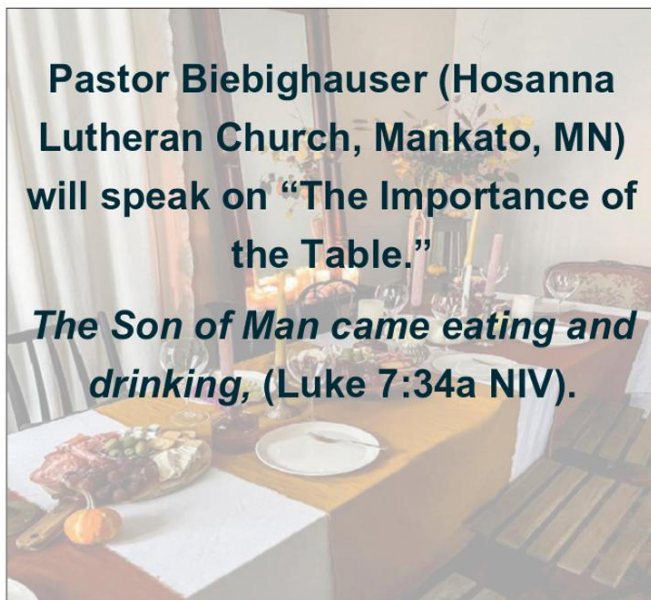
