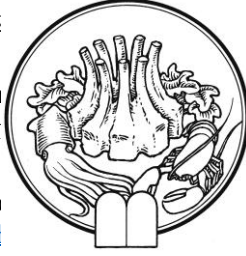

Notes to enhance your worship at Our Savior's Lutheran:

"Heaven is now yours!" This Christian truth is a reality for all believers who have had God's Name poured on them in Holy Baptism. This is a powerful and merciful moment that stays with us throughout life and into eternity. As we sing our hymn of the day LSB 566, take a careful look at the words and see what joy they bring to the heart. This hymn is an old school favorite that was originally written for the red hymnal, the TLH! "By grace I'm saved" is the purity of the gospel spoken by St. Paul in Ephesians 2:4-9. And the good news for us is that we have God's great love continually flowing in the grace filled waters of baptism. Made alive in Christ, we cling to Him by faith and continue to sing His praises with all the hymns of the Church.

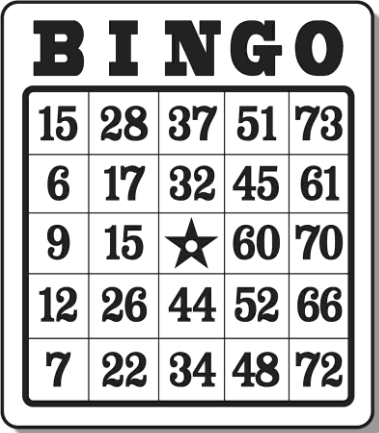
