**NOTES TO ENHANCE YOUR WORSHIP AT OSL:**

Have you ever wondered why God offers so much forgiveness on Sunday morning? Our sins are forgiven in Holy Baptism, right? So why are we forgiven at the beginning of church, and then we are forgiven again in the Lord's Supper? The answer lies in the truth we confess. We believe Christ has come to save sinners, and in fact we are counted among them. But thanks be to God, we know amazing grace through Christ Jesus our Savior! Yes, the blessed Name of God is upon us in baptism and even now saves us. Yet the promise of the Lord is that His mercies are new every morning, thus He will grant us forgiveness every day of our lives and wash us clean once again in our baptismal waters. This is precisely what is happening in Confession & Absolution. With the sign of the cross, you are reminded "God has now taken away your sin, and your assurance is in the ministry of reconciliation that Jesus performs every Sunday." Take comfort in the promises of God, especially in the truth that where Jesus is there is the forgiveness of sins. Which is why He taught us in the Supper, "Do this is remembrance of Me." We joyfully remember the Paschal Lamb, who has accomplished our salvation.

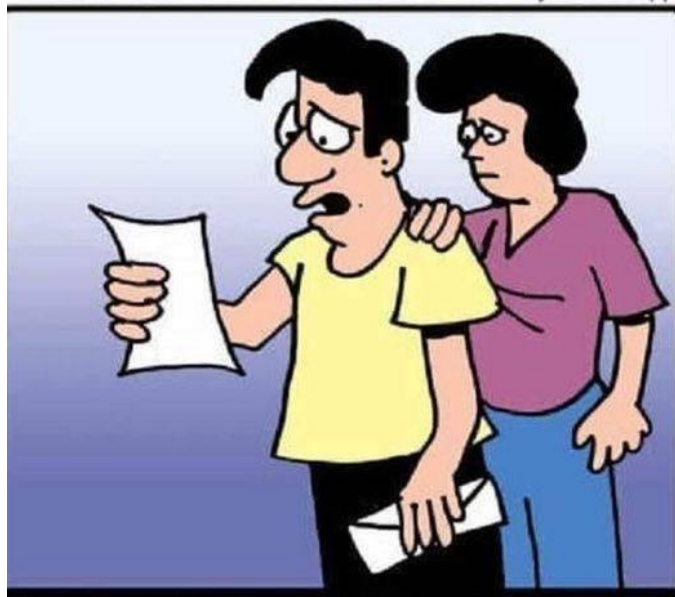
