NOTES TO ENHANCE YOUR WORSHIP AT OSL:

Martin Luther writes at great length to teach the extent of how far the body of Christ goes! As we partake of the real presence of our Lord, and the one body and one cup causes us to be ONE, there is a sharing of life together in a very real sense. If the "toe" is hurting, we bend down to see if it is okay. If the eye is hurting, we look in the mirror to see if we can find the obstruction. The same is true for the poor, the sinners, the sorrowing, the suffering. Luther asks, "How may we suffer with them? How may we bring patience or caring or defend the truth on their behalf? This is to honor and seek the betterment of the church and all Christians. The great grace and strength of Holy Communion not only forgives but empowers with the love of Christ." Recall how Jesus said, "He who has been forgiven much, loves much." How great a thing it is to be forgiven of all our sins! May the love of Christ move us in such a way to take heed of our neighbor.

The word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

For it is written,

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart."

Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what we preach to save those who believe. For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. Constitution/Bylaws Update - The Minnesota South District Constitution Committee has reviewed our Constitution and Bylaws in the first part of January. They could not grant approval to our submission. There are four minor areas of changes that we need to make. They include: Articles of Incorporation filing; requirements for membership; membership in organizations whose principles conflict with the Word of God; and calling ordained or commissioned ministers. The Constitution and Bylaws subcommittee will be reviewing their comments and making appropriate changes. After those changes are made, the congregation will need to approve the updated version, and we will need to re-submit to Minnesota South. Their next deadline is March 27, 2026. Stay tuned for more details as we migrate through this process.
