NOTES TO ENHANCE YOUR WORSHIP AT OSL:

Did you know that there are 55 volumes of Luther's collected knowledge and understanding of God's Holy Word and the work of the Church? Concordia Publishing House put out an American edition in 1960 of the complete set. I'd like to share with you some of the insights that I glean from volume 35 on Word and Sacrament. The editor shares with us that "for Luther, the Word of God is not just simply the written text of the Scriptures. It is uniquely a life imparting power. A message communicated by men in whom the Scriptures became alive!" That means the Bible is not just for reading alone, but for proclaiming. Thus, the Church is where the living Word is spoken and heard. As we see in the opening chapter of Revelation, from the mouth of the glorified Christ, a double-edged sword comes forth. This Sword of the Spirit is the Old and New Testament, in which Jesus judges through the Law and justifies through the Gospel. Take heart then that Our Savior's Lutheran Church has the *living voice of the gospel* proclaimed in your hearing every Lord's Day.

I will show you a still more excellent way.

If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give away all I have, and if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.
