**The Mission of Our Savior's Lutheran Church and School is
'connecting families in Christ' by proclaiming the forgiveness of
sin in the Gospel and the Sacraments.**

This Sunday we celebrate the Baptism of our Lord as the kickoff to our Epiphany season. The discovery or revealing of the Son of God was initiated with a star in the night sky over Bethlehem. So, God decided that a bright light over Israel would point the way to Jesus. Certainly, we want to bring that same monumental moment into our sanctuary when we light our candles and sing *Silent Night* for Christmas Eve. We even prepare for the day by lighting our Advent candles and then finally the Christ candle to mark His birth. It's not too hard to see that the title, Light of the World, should be applied to Jesus. This is also why the Christ candle is lit during Holy Baptism, no matter what day of the year it takes place. And a blessing is given to the baptized, "Live always in the light of Christ. Be ever watchful for His coming that you may meet Him with joy and enter with Him into the marriage feast of the Lamb in His kingdom, which shall have no end." And how was the groom greeted by the attendants? The five wise bridesmaids greeted Him with lamps brightly burning.

Epistle

Romans 6:1-11

What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. For one who has died has been set free from sin. Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Luke 3:15-22

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the third chapter.

As the people were in expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Christ, John answered them all, saying, "I baptize you with water, but he who is mightier than I is coming, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

So with many other exhortations he preached good news to the people. But Herod the tetrarch, who had been reproved by him for Herodias, his brother's wife, and for all the evil things that Herod had done, added this to them all, that he locked up John in prison.

Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heavens were opened, and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form, like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

The Liturgical Color for Today's Observance of the Baptism of Jesus is White: White symbolizes purity and is used on days that mark pivotal events in the life of Christ—His birth, epiphany, baptism, transfiguration, resurrection, and ascension. Regarding His baptism, Jesus didn't need it to be made pure. He was the sinless Son of God. He was baptized, he explained, "to fulfill all righteousness" (Matt. 3:15).
