NOTES TO ENHANCE YOUR WORSHIP AT OSL:

As we gather at the altar of the Lord for holy communion, it is a wonderful thing that we bring our children to be present. I understand how several of our young people could hold out their hand as well, waiting for the host, even though they are 6 or 7 years old. The desire to be fed just like everyone else is a natural reaction. But of course, anyone who approaches the altar for holy communion must first be examined. What we can do, as our young people grow in the knowledge of the Lord, is bless them in their holy baptism. "The Lord bless you and keep you in the waters of Holy Baptism unto life everlasting." I hope and pray these gospel words bring comfort to little hearts and minds, offering them a reminder and encouragement that they are included as God's children. Having been *aus der Taufe gehoben*, lifted from the baptismal waters, these little lambs bear God's Name as well, and thus salvation is theirs right now!

But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words. For these men are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day. But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel:

"And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; even on my male servants and female servants in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy. And I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and vapor of smoke; the sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the day of the Lord comes, the great and magnificent day.
