NOTES TO ENHANCE YOUR WORSHIP AT OSL:

One of the comforts of church is that we belong to a community of saints. You once joined this community by the rite of Holy Baptism, and thus you were welcomed as a child of God. We have over 500 baptized members that belong to Our Savior's Lutheran Church. What a joy to be among so many Lutherans in Hutchinson! The second form of fellowship is our communion of faith. As we believe and confess our Christian faith, those that have taken confirmation are welcome to join us in our confession. Did you know that going to Holy Communion is a joining with a congregation in their confession? We call that table fellowship, where Christ joins us together as one! We participate in the same bread, as we participate in the same cup, and thus Jesus makes us one body. Being a member of the church carries with it a connection to our fellow saints, as we are His body. Thus, you absolutely belong to God and to one another as a result of this holy communion. Luther was quite exuberant then in encouraging his fellow Christians to "zum sacrament gehen." (Go to the sacrament) We find real and lasting peace in the forgiveness of our sins and life together.
