**NOTES TO ENHANCE YOUR WORSHIP AT OSL:**

As we have entered the Season of Pentecost, we get to see the green paraments and the symbols of the Church that go along with them. I enjoy seeing the Chi Rho as the center focus, namely the Greek letters for "Christ". He is surrounded by Word & Sacrament, even the font is in close proximity to the front of the altar. And Martin Luther tells us, "Everything that is in Church must be living. Christ did not put His grace in dead writing and seals, but in living words and signs which we use Sunday to Sunday. And this is what is meant when the pastor elevates the host and the cup, by which he addresses us!" The body and blood of our Lord is a living sign of the testament in which we inherit the remission of all sins and everlasting life. Jesus has arrived and is present in the bread and the cup. In, with, and under these elements is the living Christ, who shall bless us from His meaningful sacrifice. It is our duty and our blessing to remember all that Jesus has done for us.

## Epistle

### Romans 6:12-23

Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal bodies, to make you obey their passions. Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and your members to God as instruments for righteousness. For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.

What then? Are we to sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? But thanks be to God, that you who were once slaves of sin have become obedient from the heart to the standard of teaching to which you were committed, and, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness. I am speaking in human terms, because of your natural limitations. For just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to lawlessness leading to more lawlessness, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness leading to sanctification.

When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. But what fruit were you getting at that time from the things of which you are now ashamed? The end of those things is death. But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the fruit you get leads to sanctification and its end, eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.
