THE HAND OF THE LORD WHO IS RISEN

This day of days, this feast of feasts, is the climax of our Lenten meditations on “The Hand of the Lord.” It brings all of God’s promises in the Old Testament, all of our Lord’s words and works of His earthly ministry, all the peace, all the healing, and all the hope of eternal life now given to you and to each person who comes to the risen and reigning Lord of all in repentance and faith, here where He promises to be through Word and Sacrament for us. We thank the Lord for all His grace and mercy shown to us as we wend our way through the various days and times of our earthly lives. Yet all of that is but a prelude to the great and promised feast of the day of “the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come” (Nicene Creed). As God the Father did not abandon His Son to the corruption of the grave but raised Him bodily to endless life, so also is our certain hope. God will not abandon you now or ever.

NOTES TO ENHANCE YOUR WORSHIP AT OSL:

Luther teaches us, in his very first book on Word & Sacrament, that we must approach the Lord in church differently than what our sins demand. It is normal to the human heart, to expect God to be angry and thus wrathful toward our sin. And your neighbor, who is pricked in conscience by their sin, must be reassured that God is loving and forgiving. John 3:16 speaks to the gospel that is primary and central to our relationship with God. Any worry or doubt must be confronted by this good news. God loves the world, and as an answer to sin He has given us His Son. “In the entire gospel we read of no one of whom God required anything but faith. Out of grace He bestowed all His benefits full and free upon the unworthy, bidding them afterward to live aright and to go in peace.” Even King David praises God, “Lord, thou art slow to anger, merciful, and truthful.” This same truth saves us from all sins if we cling to it by faith. It is thus our relationship with Christ Jesus that leads us to do so.
