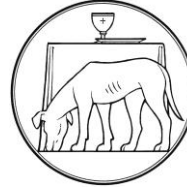

NOTES TO ENHANCE YOUR WORSHIP AT OSL:

Martin Luther takes us to school today by giving us food for thought about the testament of Christ. He writes, "The best and greatest part about the Sacrament is the words of God. Without them the bread and wine is like a body without a soul, a cask without wine, a purse without money, a sheath without a knife, a case without a jewel! Without a divine vow, there is no sacrament. If you attend church and pay attention only to the bread and wine, you are not observing the Sabbath even half-way!" The sacred event of hearing Jesus' words is a remembrance that Christ is giving a promise for you. Though the words were spoken 2000 years ago, they are spoken again at the altar that you might hear them aloud. Jesus intends to accomplish something divine by His powerful word. So believe and take to heart that the Lord means what He says, "This is my body. This is my blood." May the real presence of the Lord give you peace and true comfort.
