NOTES TO ENHANCE YOUR WORSHIP AT OSL:

Martin Luther takes our bread and wine connection of Holy Communion a step further. Christ has appointed the sacrament in such a way that we should be united with Him and made to be one body. "What is more intimate, deep, and indivisible than the union of food with the one being fed? He makes whatever concerns us, His concern as well!" And thus, Jesus understands in our human nature, we must eat. Every Hebrew at the Passover of Exodus had to eat of the lamb. Then the blood was on the door post. We must eat of the Lamb of God and then we even partake of the cup. While this is a mystery of the sacramental union of Christ with the bread and wine, it is a blessed accomplishment of God that we should be united with Him in such a personal way for our salvation. So complete is the fellowship of Christ that our sins assail Him and His righteousness protects us, until at the Last... sin is destroyed. Thanks be to God!
