

### NOTES TO ENHANCE YOUR WORSHIP AT OSL:

Another gem from Martin Luther in volume 35 of *Luther's Works.* "In the absolution of the Divine Service we let faith be the chief thing, the legacy through which one may attain the grace of God." Now what about for those who come to church with a troubled conscience? Though they have faith, they are terrified by their transgression. They would gladly be loosed from sin, but they are hesitant to approach God in His house. Certainly, this Christian has every right to speak with their pastor during the week for private confession. Consider the words of Isaiah who teaches, "Cry to the fainthearted and say to them, 'Be comforted you faint of heart; behold your God!'" Christ also says, "Come to me, you who are burdened and heavy laden, and I will give you rest." It is your faith in Jesus and love for Him, because of the gospel of John 3:16 that helps you find comfort. Ask the Lord to increase your faith and trust in Him, believing that the Lord is merciful and His grace is sufficient for your sins. For this good news we thank you, dearest Jesus! Amen
