Be assured there is no wrong answer in how you feel, especially if you're talking about God's love and mercy for you. Always know you can use the trifold in the pew racks. You can also look at the Small Catechism in the hymnal on page 327 for some insights. Martin Luther tells it this way. "The Lord's Supper is nothing else than an exceedingly rich and everlasting testament bequeathed to us by Christ Himself. The treasure of which exceeds the mere pittance of 10,000 gold coins." Jesus told the disciples, "With great desire I have desired to eat this Passover with you." Likewise, every Sunday Jesus longs to pour out His eternal treasures on our behalf. May we with hungry souls and joyful faith partake of Holy Communion for the forgiveness of all our sins and the treasure of eternal life.
